

Investing for Success

Under this agreement for 2018
Churchill State School will receive

\$206,151*

This funding will be used to:

- support each student at risk of not achieving Regional Reading Benchmarks with tailored support programs and particular emphasis in Prep to Year 2
- increase the number of students reading at Regional Benchmark or above to 75%
- purchase ICT materials to support reading initiatives across the school
- increase the number of students reading at Regional Upper Two Bands Benchmark to 35%.

Our initiatives include:


- embedding the Churchill State School Reading Framework and adopting consistent teaching protocols
- intensive teacher aide support during literacy for support in guided reading
- continuing the Reading Champions program for students reading below Regional Benchmarks in Prep to Year 2
- funding a school-based Chaplain two days a week to deliver social and emotional well-being programs to increase students engagement at school
- implementing Bump It Up Walls in Prep to Year 6 to provide success criteria for students
- increasing funding for the Speech Language Therapist to implement early intervention (Prep- Year 1) and programs to increase the vocabulary of all students
- continuing to build teacher capacity to develop a deep understanding of the Australian Curriculum to collaboratively plan curriculum units with support from a Head of Curriculum and teacher, released to participate in year level planning days
- installing interactive touch panels in all classrooms to support whole class guided reading.

Increasing teacher aide support across school for literacy support in classrooms and running Reading Champions program.	\$129 451
Providing additional 0.1 speech pathologist support.	\$9 700
Providing TRS to enable teaching teams to engage in collaborative data inquiry, action learning, planning, classroom visits and professional conversations.	\$20 000
Funding for school-based chaplain.	\$12 000
Purchasing and installation of interactive touch panels for whole class guided reading.	\$35 000
